

Oregon Psychoanalytic Institute:

Clinical Training Program: For clinicians who want to explore the full spectrum of psychoanalytic theory and technique and become a psychoanalyst. **Academic Training Program:** For mental health and other professionals wanting to experience psychoanalysis and the training, without becoming a psychoanalyst.

Psychoanalytic Psychotherapy Program:
