

ADULT PSYCHOANALYTIC TRAINING

Psychoanalysts of all theoretical orientations share a deep respect for the uniqueness of each individual, and a commitment to collaborating authentically with their patients in a process of discovery and growth. These values are embedded in the comprehensive and broad-based curriculum of Psychoanalytic Training at the Oregon Psychoanalytic Center. Analytic candidates are encouraged to think critically, to learn through self-knowledge, and to draw insight and inspiration from the many great psychoanalytic thinkers and clinicians, past and present.

The three pillars of psychoanalytic training—personal training analysis, seminars, and supervised analytic work—provide rich, varied, and profound opportunities for experiential and didactic learning.

Admissions requirements - We seek excellence in educational and clinical backgrounds; an aptitude for the practice of psychoanalysis; and qualities of maturity, integrity and intellectual honesty. We follow APsaA's requirements for the selection of candidates.

Applicants must possess the highest academic degree associated with the licensure of his/her profession, and have a specified amount of postgraduate clinical experience.

OPC teaches all major psychoanalytic theories, from classical to contemporary. Classes are structured to provide opportunities to contrast traditional and newer theories, along with scientific research that has bearing on psychoanalytic thought.

The Oregon Psychoanalytic Center trains mental health professionals in the theory and practice of psychoanalysis and psychoanalytic psychotherapy.

PSYCHOANALYTIC PSYCHOTHERAPY

Two-year certificate program for licensed mental health professionals of all disciplines, who want to enhance their therapeutic knowledge and skills

evolving, diverse, dynamic

This robust, energetic, and accessible program differs from the psychoanalytic training program in that it focuses solely on the practice of psychoanalytic psychotherapy.

The Center offers a new class every two years. We urge interested students to start the application process at any time, as applications are reviewed in the order received. In preparation for matriculation, applicants may, meanwhile, want to take classes offered by our Continuing Education Program.

There are three elements essential to psychoanalytic psychotherapy training: coursework, supervision of training cases, and personal experience of a psychoanalytically informed therapy.

Admissions requirements – This program is open to mental health professionals of all disciplines, including psychiatry, psychology, social work, marriage and family therapy, counseling and psychiatric nursing. Participants must be licensed in Oregon and carry professional liability insurance.

OPC Faculty members, trained in psychoanalytic institutes around the country as well as at OPC, share some fundamental attributes distinguished reputations, scholarly contributions, and excellence in teaching.

Through deepening relationships with their clients, OPC clinicians, and those they treat, achieve better results and greater professional fulfillment.

EARLY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

Fifteen-month Infant Observation course trains clinicians in psychological aspects of early development, beginning with prenatal life

empowering insights, increasing clinical skills

OPC offers a 15 month Infant Observation course, consisting of weekly observations of mother/parent and infant in the infant's home. The observations begin just prior to the birth. Students also participate in twice monthly seminars. Infant observation, based on the Tavistock model, is an important component of many psychoanalytic and psychodynamic training programs around the world. Participants find the IO seminar to be an effective and engaging way to learn experientially about the process of observing and being an observer, which applies to a wide spectrum of clinical activity.

In addition to the IO seminar, the EDP is currently developing Listening Mothers and Secure Beginnings programs, which will train clinicians to work with parents and their young children in developing strong relationships as a foundation for emotional development.

Admission requirements - Open to mental health and other interested professionals. Applicants will be interviewed prior to admission to determine suitability of the seminar for them.
